Students may choose to apply their credits towards a CONSTRUCTION SHSM. To obtain a SHSM—RED SEAL the students must obtain 4 construction related credits along with 2 cooperative education credits. Please speak with Mr. Daminato or Ms. McRae to determine the other requirements and how to apply. Students in the SHSM program also obtain certifications in CPR—LEVEL C, STANDARD FIRST AID, WORKING AT HEIGHTS, and another optional certification at one cost.


The **Construction Co-op program** is a **FOUR credit program**— a two credit Construction course (TCC3E2) in and two credits in Co-op.

TCC3E2 - a two credit Construction Carpentry credit taken during periods 1 and 2 in first semester. Students will obtain the skills necessary to prepare them for a placement in the Construction sector. Students should have a keen interest in the skilled trades. They will obtain certifications in Basic Health and Safety, WHMIS and Basic Electrical Safety.

Students also get a dual credit “Introduction to Mechanical Trades” from Fleming College and learn about HRAC, Electrical and Plumbing. This credit will be listed on a college transcript.

The course includes various trips to the college, construction sites, Habitat for Humanity and businesses in the construction sector. Students in this program will be given preference to cooperative education placements in at the Habitat for Humanity Build and Restore as well as other placements in the construction sector.

Requirements: Students must be in grades 10-12, previous experience in technology, and Green Patch work boots. Please speak with a Guidance Counsellor if there are financial concerns.



This year’s students participated in an ICE activity with students from another school in our Board to develop a marketing and strategic plan to support a local agency.



COOPERATIVE EDUCATION (COP20) —2 CREDITS

This 2 credit course provides the students with the opportunity to apply the skills acquired in TCC3E2. It is an excellent way for the students to explore future pathways. Students will be placed at the Habitat Build site or Restore, or another construction related placement.

Students earn the credits through the hours they complete at the placement. All students attend pre-placement days for the first two weeks of the semester. Units include Job Readiness, Rights and Responsibilities, Health and Safety and Workplace Opportunities and Challenges. Students receive instruction and monitoring by the cooperative education teacher. Please see Ms. Langstaff or a Guidance counsellor for more information.

Requirements for co-op:

- Must be 16 years of age and in grades 11 or 12
- Have a positive attitude
- Demonstrate good attendance, punctuality and work habits
- Show commitment to the program
